#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course is intended to reinforce the concepts learned in the first levels of the primary school through enriching activities that will enhance in the students the four skills: listening, reading, writing and speaking. The lessons are based on a wide variety of topics, which draw on the students' own knowledge and also their need to learn about the world. The topics are carefully chosen to be relevant to the students' age and interests, ranging from, for example, home and family, domestic and wild animals and others. This variety is motivating in both the short term and the long one. Keeping students focus and enthusiastic about learning through the classes. Besides, two or more lessons in each unit include a section related to one of these content areas: Social studies, math, art, or drama. These activities require students to use their general knowledge and skills and will help them develop critical thinking skills while practicing English. Also, students will have phonic lessons which cover both individual sounds and longer aspects of pronunciation, leading to greater awareness of the way English is spoken and to an improvement in the students' own pronunciation. Students will familiarize with the language and will start and follow short conversations handling the vocabulary learnt in class.

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#### *METHODOLOGY*

The methodology will be mainly communicative and it is required that the teacher is prepared to assist students in all activities they need. The course will have a variety of activities and it will be necessary to have phonic lessons to improve pronunciation, build vocabulary and improve students' ability to understand, analyze, and create their own language. Also, students will be able to have a section called **Episode Story**, the fifth lesson of each unit resolves around an episode of an on-going, self-contained story. Those lessons offer reading comprehension, consolidation of language structures, vocabulary expansion, and the opportunity for students to build literacy in a controlled way. Each unit includes a variety of catchy songs, most specially written for the series too. The last lesson of every unit includes a grammar summary with explanations of the structures learned in the unit and exercises that revisit this grammar. Besides, each unit concludes with a project, in which students are asked to create something real. To learn a second language is also to have fun and for that reason games are a very useful tool in the classroom. Each unit has games which have questions and tasks that recycle the vocabulary and grammar covered in each unit. Each two units students will have to develop a review where they will reinforce knowledge. Also, students will have the opportunity to have laboratory classes to reinforce their learning.
